- Intellect governing mind
 - Not suppression
 - Objectivity arise from knowledge
- Unaffected by the world of opposites (dvandvas)
 - E.g. Watching a movie
 - Even This Shall Pass Away by T. Tilton

- Lack of knowledge = Lack of Objectivity
 - = Involvement in our own nature

CH.5 — INITIATIVE VS INCENTIVE

- Without objectivity, mind determines where attention goes
 - Intellect: Mind = River-banks: Water

- Unproductive thought channels
- Need a method to keep our attention on task
 - Incentive External inducement
 - Initiative Internal motivation



CH.5 — INITIATIVE VS INCENTIVE

- Two methods of inspiring action
- Incentive is addressed to the mind and its demands
 - Creates entitlement; leverages selfishness
 - Limited in scope Only applies within the boundary
 - Can be gamed
 - Diminishing returns Neutralisation
 - Incentive removed, work stops



CH.5 — INITIATIVE VS INCENTIVE

- Initiative is inspired by an ideal
 - Ideal circumvents mind's selfish tendencies
 - Promotes action in novel areas
 - Can't be gamed
 - Initiative increases with application
 - Self-sustaining
